Happy Home Learning

FS2 Homework

Literacy

Please help your child to write their full name; Christian and Surname. We would like them to secure this skill by the end of this half term in readiness for Year One. Recently we have been looking at words in the 'at' family (cat, mat etc.), please help your child to write a list of 'at words'. Please help your child to learn the Dangerous words in your child's spelling book – new ones to follow soon.

Numeracy

In numeracy, we have been thinking about sharing and problem solving. Please practise sharing objects between 2 and 3 groups. This can be recorded in their own way – written in their homework book or a photograph of their practical work.

Please also fill in "I am really proud my child can now..." slip. Available on the welcome table in the classroom. This will be used as part of your child's assessment profile.

Please practise your speed sounds on page 26-29 of your diary. Please read all three of your books and make sure your reads are recorded in your diary so we can score as many points as possible in our reading race. Remember your book bag must be in class every day and especially on a Monday so we can count our reading race points.


Spellings

Lateness

Last term there were **76** recorded late marks and we must stress the importance that children are in school at the start of the day in order not to miss vital learning opportunities.

Every morning after register the children have literacy and numeracy sessions and arriving late and missing part or all of these sessions means that the child will be at a severe disadvantage compared to pupils who consistently arrive on time. This learning will always be lost as there is no time to revisit it again. We do understand that on very rare occasions there will be times when problems occur which result in children arriving late but persistent lateness will lead to low levels of progress in their education.

Medical & Dental Appointments

Can we please ask all parents to make medical and dental appointments outside school hours or in school holidays wherever possible. Should you be unable to make an appointment outside school please ensure that your child attends school prior to the appointment or immediately after the appointment.

Summer has finally arrived this week and we would like to stress the importance of protecting your child from the beautiful sunshine that we are currently enjoying. Please make sure that a sun hat is provided to wear during outdoor activities and that you apply sun cream before arriving at school.
