FS2 Homework

<u>Literacy</u>

Please help your child to write lots of rhyming alien words from the planet Zig (mig, sig etc) Use your homework book to record as we will share them next week. Who can get the most?

Numeracy

Please practise addition using counting on as a strategy.

E.g. 5 + 4: Place a counter on the numeral 5 and make 4 jumps to reach the total. It is very important that the children learn to say after completing, 5 add 4 makes 9 in order to support understanding of their actions. Try lots of addition problems.

Science

This week we have learnt about the five senses. Pick an interesting item of food or drink. What does it look like? What does it feel like? What does it smell like? What does it taste like? What does it sound like as you eat or drink it?

Reading

Try and share a book with a grown-up **every day**. Remember, you will be a 'Super Reader' if you read every day. Discuss the main characters and the actions that they make. What was your favourite part and why? If you have read a non-fiction text, what facts have you learnt?

School Meals Review

We have been working with Riverside Catering to review our school meals and ensure that we are offering the meal options and dining experience that children enjoy. After observing lunchtimes, talking to children, and conducting taster sessions with the children, the following changes will be made to the Chilled Choice options...

From the 4th June, all chilled choice options will be served on a high fibre bread cake. (This is similar to a 50/50 bread that you would purchase). The children have tasted it at lunchtime periods and have loved the taste.

In our review, we also found that many sandwich fillings were not being chosen on a daily basis. In response, the following fillings will now be available...
