FS2 Homework

We have introduced 6 tricky words so far this term I, the, my, no, go, to. We call these red words (Fred our phonics puppet says "you can't Fred a Red" they are also known as tricky words as they are not phonetically spelt and therefore need to be learned by sight. Please ask your child to practise spelling them using a red pen/crayon in their homework books or make a tricky word mat to stick on the fridge they could even write secret passwords to stick up around your house. Please keep recapping these words little and often with your child.

In maths we have been looking at the composition of 5 and have been using the number rhyme of '5 little speckled frogs' to help us. We have been problem solving thinking about how many frogs will be in the pool if for example 2 are still on the log. Please play practical games with your child showing different ways of making 5.

Maths

Y1-This week we have been working on inverse calculations. Can your child make and tell/write a subtraction story using equipment and then tell the inverse addition story. e.g 'I started with the whole seven, I subtracted 2 and now I can see the other part is 5. Now I have 5 and if I add the part 2 back I have 7 again which is the whole' $7 - 2 = 5$ $5 + 2 = 7$

Can you show two different ways to make each amount? You could draw the item and draw around the coins you used to pay.
