### Literacy

### Numeracy

This week your child will be bringing home a set of numbers to 20 that they have cut out and used in school. Please work together to practise number recognition and help them to place them in the correct order. Can your child order them independently?

## Year 1 Homework

### Reading

Please read your reading books. Practise your speed sounds on pages 23-26 of your diary.

### Spellings

**Next week, your child will take their Phonics Screening Check. (Results will be reported on their Record of Achievement at the end of July.)**

### Maths

We have been grouping objects in twos. Use objects to make pairs up to 20. Then count in twos to find the total. If you can do this try making groups of five (up to 20) and count in fives to find the total.

Make a sandwich. Can you cut it into quarters. Can you explain what quartering is? Tell the quartering story. "I started with a whole sandwich, I cut it into 4 equal parts. Now I have four quarters.

## Year 2 Homework

### Spellings

Continue learning the common exception words for the Sponsored Spell.

### Maths

This week we have been measuring heights. Can you collect different objects and order them in height order, from shortest to tallest? Write some comparative sentences using the following vocabulary: **shorter taller shortest tallest**

E.g. The bottle is taller than the cup but shorter than the cereal box.

The cereal box is the tallest.

The cup is the shortest.

### Geography

We are learning about how chocolate is made, starting with where cocoa beans are grown. Can you research the countries where cocoa beans are grown and find them on a world map?

### Reading

Keep reading at home! The Reading Race will start again this half term so this week's reads will be counted for Week 1. Let's see which class can get the highest score!
