FS 1 Happy Home Learning

This week we have been sharing the story of the Little Red Riding Hood.

Personal Social & Emotional Development: Bake some cakes or biscuits to send to Grandma. Take a photo of your creations, we would love to see them.

Communication & Language Development: This week we have been sharing the story of Little Red Riding Hood. The story is set in the woods, can you think of any other stories you know that are set in the woods?

Physical Development: Draw a picture of Grandma's cottage in the woods.

FS2 Homework

Literacy - Talk about the Three Little Pigs story. Can you act it out with a grown up? You could make a pig or a wolf mask to use.

Practice writing the letter sounds that you know using a pencil. Check in your diary for the correct letter formation.

Maths - Find five toys. Practice partitioning them in different ways. You could use toy cars. put some in a pretend car park; and some on a pretend road. How many different ways can you do this?

Practice writing numerals 0 to 5. Check that you are holding your pencil correctly.

Y1 Maths

This week the children have been learning to find the missing part in an addition number sentence. We are encouraging them to say the whole sentence and tell a story to be able to find the answer.

For example: $5 + \underline{\quad} = 7$. 'Five add $\underline{\quad}$ is the same as 7. 7 is the whole amount I need. 5 is the part I already have. What is the part I don't have? Using buttons/raisins – find the whole amount (7) – separate the part I already know (5). What is left is the missing part (2). Ask your child to complete the following number sentences in their homework book:

$$3 + \underline{\quad} = 5 \quad 5 + \underline{\quad} = 8 \quad 4 + \underline{\quad} = 4 \quad \underline{\quad} + 3 = 6 \quad \underline{\quad} + 2 = 5 \quad 0 + \underline{\quad} = 5$$

Y2 Maths

10 3 1 12 15 2 14

Use the digits above to make an addition number sentence. What is the whole? What are the parts?

Now can you make the other 3 associated number sentences e.g

12 + 1 = 13 **1 + 12 = 13** **13 – 1 = 12** **13 – 12 = 1**

Now make some other facts and find the associated facts. Use equipment if you need to.
