Safer Internet week

The week beginning the 4th of February, we will be celebrating safer internet week around school. We will begin with a whole school assembly looking at how to keep safe online and throughout the week we will be incorporating exciting short lessons, discussions and activities reinforcing how to stay safe online.

FS1 Happy Home Learning

This week the children have been practising writing their name, please support them at home. Literacy

This week we have been learning to ask questions, which is a very tricky skill at this age. Practise thinking about a question eg. Where are you going? When will you be here? What is your name? Practise asking lots of questions to each other.

Maths

In maths this week we are continuing to learn about 2D shape. Draw a picture of a London building/place of interest for us to display eg. Big Ben, Buckingham Palace, London Eye. Talk about the 2D shapes you are using to draw your picture eg. The windows are square or the door is a rectangle.

Maths

Pick two two-digit numbers up to 20 and compare them.

E.g. 12 and 15

They both have one ten.

12 has 2 ones and 15 has 5 ones.

12 is smaller than 15.

15 is bigger than 12.

Literacy

We have been writing instructions this week. Can you say instructions when you are doing activities at home? E.g. How to Wash Your Hands

First turn the tap on. Then run your hands under the water. Next add soap and wash your hands. After that rinse your hands with water. Finally dry your hands with a towel.

Can you recall all the multiplication facts for the 2s, 5s, 10s times table in order?

E.g. $1 \times 2 = 2$ $2 \times 2 = 4$ $3 \times 2 = 6$ etc.

$1 \times 5 = 5$ $2 \times 5 = 10$ $3 \times 5 = 15$ etc.

$1 \times 10 = 10$ $2 \times 10 = 20$ $3 \times 10 = 30$ etc.

Tell your grown-up what you notice about the multiples of 2s, 5s, and 10s.

Literacy

This week we have been finding out about nurse sharks. Can you research nurse sharks at home and write some fantastic facts to use in your writing next week.
