

Online Safety Advice for Parents on Age Ratings from 'Parent Zone'

Age ratings are used across many different types of online content and platforms, from films and TV shows to social media, to games. But what might seem like a simple way for parents and carers to know what's safe and appropriate for their child is much more complex.

With different age ratings applied in different places, and the ratings not always considering everything a parent might want to consider when deciding whether a platform or piece of content is suitable for their child. This new guide will help the families and children you work with understand how they can use age ratings to make the right decisions for them.

The advice covers why age ratings can vary, the different rating systems used, some of the issues to consider when making decisions about content and platforms that aren't covered in age ratings - and how parents and carers can approach conversations about age appropriateness in an informed way.

Personal Social & Emotional Development:

Help at home this week by recycling your rubbish. Can you help to sort the rubbish into the recycling bins? Try counting how many of each type of recycling you have. How many plastic bottles have you recycled this week? Remember to bring any cereal boxes into school.

Communication & Language Development:

Go on a listening walk. You could go around your house or outside, practice listening to the different sounds you hear. Talk about what you heard. Did you hear loud or quiet sounds? Did you recognise all the sounds?

Physical Development:

With a grown up to support you cut up a potato and carrot. Dip the vegetables into paint and make an ABAB (repeating) pattern on a strip of paper. If you make the paper long enough, you could make it into a hat?

FS2 Homework

Literacy - Talk about Jack and the Beanstalk story. Can you act it out with a grown up? Can you write a simple sentence listening to the sounds in words. eg. Jack sold the cow.

Practice writing the numbers that you know using a pencil. Check in your diary for the correct number formation.

Maths - Find six toys. Practice partitioning them in different ways. You could use toy teddies and two mats. How many different ways can you do this? Tell your grown up what you have done.

Practice writing numerals 0 to 6. Check that you are holding your pencil correctly.

Maths

Y1-

This week the children have been learning that subtraction is the inverse of addition. Can they write the addition number sentence that matches the subtraction number sentence: For example: If I know that $4 - 3 = 1$ then I also know that $3 + 1 = 4$. Write the matching addition number sentences to match these subtraction sentences:

$8 - 3 = 5$

$5 - 3 = 2$

$7 - 1 = 6$

$6 - 5 = 1$

$5 - 5 = 0$

$10 - 0 = 10$

Y2 - We have been learning to find the missing part in an addition number sentence. Please encourage your child to say the whole sentence and tell a story to be able to find the missing part.

For example: $15 + \underline{\quad} = 17$. 'Fifteen add something is the same as 17. 17 is the whole amount. 15 is the part I already have. What is the part I don't have? Using straws/pencils for tens and buttons/raisins for ones – find the whole amount (17) – separate the part I already know (15). What is left is the missing part (2). Ask your child to complete the following number sentences in their homework book:

$13 + \underline{\quad} = 15$

$15 + \underline{\quad} = 18$

$14 + \underline{\quad} = 14$

$\underline{\quad} + 13 = 16$

$\underline{\quad} + 12 = 15$

$0 + \underline{\quad} = 15$


