The children are really enjoying retelling the Tiger who came to Tea story and are remembering it really well. This week we have baked buns (luckily the tiger didn't turn up so we got to eat them). FS2 Homework

This week we have been continuing our learning about jungle animals and have been reading the story 'Giraffes can't dance'. Please ask your child to think of a message they could send to Gerald to cheer him up after the animals all laughed at him. Children can write the message in their homework books or record it and send it on class dojo.

In maths we have been learning about comparison and using the language of 'more than', 'fewer than' and 'an equal number' to describe how many objects there are in each set. Please practise this at home using Lego pieces, counters or small toys and think about which group has more than, fewer than or are equal. We'd love to see a picture of this on dojo.

Maths

Y1 Can you tell your own subtraction number sentences using the First, Then, Now structure? E.g. First there were 8 birds on the wall. Then 3 flew away. Now there are 5 birds on the wall. As a challenge can you tell the corresponding addition story. First there were 5 birds on the wall. Then 3 came to join them. Now there are 8 birds on the wall. $8 - 3 = 5$ $5 + 3 = 8$

Y2 Class 6 This week we have been adding/subtracting a multiple of ten to/from a two digit number. We have achieved good accuracy using the Diennes (tens and units) equipment. What do you notice about the tens and units when a multiple of ten is added/subtracted? Try these and then challenge yourself to some of your own.


What is the Nurturing Programme?

Children are rewarding, stimulating and fun, but looking after them can be stressful and challenging.

The Nurturing Programme helps deal with those challenges so that you can have a calmer, happier life.

A tried and tested programme, it helps us think about what we do, why we do it and how it makes us feel.

The Building Blocks of the Nurturing Programme



What does it cover?

Over the 10-week Programme, you will look at lots of different topics, including:

Understanding
why children behave as they do

Recognising
the feelings behind behaviour (ours and theirs)

Exploring
different approaches to discipline

Finding ways to develop co-operation and self-discipline in children

Learning the importance of looking after ourselves

Practical information

Partners are welcome and it's also fine to come on your own or with a relative or friend

There are ten 2-hour sessions with a tea and coffee break

8-10 parents are invited and there are two Family Links trained group leaders

Some groups provide a creche; check with group leaders beforehand

You need to come to all ten sessions as they fit together like a puzzle
