Thank you to all parents who have had to arrange testing for their children due to them having COVID-19 symptoms. I know that it has been a frustrating task and fraught with difficulties for some. It is however, the best way to protect you and your family and also others at school. It also allows your child to return to school as soon as possible. Please note that appointments need to be made for both drive through and walk through testing centres.

Whilst children are self-isolating, we will send home learning tasks for children to complete with you at home. This learning will mirror what children attending school will be undertaking. It will be a mixture of practical, written and online tasks. We will also include tasks that can be accessed via the Government approved on line learning platform **Oak National Academy**. These are a mixture of recorded video lessons, paper-based tasks and quizzes.

We will send out this **Isolation Home learning** at the start of each week. Routine weekly homework will still be included on our Friday Newsletter.
