

Maths

This week we have been learning to read time on an analogue clock. If you have one of these in your house children could practise O’ clock and half past times. Can your child say..... ‘I know it is 3 O’ clock because the minute hand is pointing to zero (at the top) and the hour hand is pointing to the hour of 3.

‘I know it is half past 5 because the minute hand is pointing to 30 minutes (at the bottom) and the hour hand is half way past the hour of 5. **Please don’t refer to the minute hand pointing to 12 or 6 as it actually doesn’t, it point to the dots round the edge of the clock which are the minutes.**
