


Spare Clothes

Attendance

Thank you to all parents and carers who regularly support their child's attendance and you will have recently been given details of your child's attendance at parent consultations and by email. Attending school on a regular, punctual basis is one the most important ways of making sure your child gets off to the best possible start in life.

Throughout the month of June 24, Year 1 children will take their Year 1 Phonic Screening Check, this is for all Year 1 pupils - and Year 2 screening check re-takes

It is vital that your child is not absent from school during the following periods as tests cannot be re-taken at a later date.

Year 1 Phonics Screening checks will start during the week commencing – Monday 10th June 2024.

Year 2 Phonics Screening check re-takes (for those children who did not pass in Year 1) will start during the week commencing – Monday 10th June 2024.

FS1 Happy Home Learning

Song of the week: Dingle Dangle Scarecrow

We have been learning to retell the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff. Ask your child to orally retell this story to you and encourage them to use key language from the text (e.g. 'Who's that trip-trapping over my bridge?')

FS2 Homework

This week the children have been describing the London landmarks. Encourage your child to make their own landmark, e.g. with building blocks, in the woods, drawing, painting, and write a simple sentence to describe it.

It is big

It is strong

Reading

Please support your child with the fluency aspect of reading by sharing your child's reading book as often as you can. The more you read, the speedier you get!

Spellings

Y1- our are love see tree green meet week What other words can you write that have 'what can you see' ee ?

Y2 Class 6 -Check your child can spell the above words, then try **happily, cruelly, calmly, gently, cheerfully**

Maths

Y1- This week we have been making subtraction calculations and recording the matching equations

Use something practical. Decide what the whole is (within 10) Then Get your child to split it into parts and identify the parts e.g Five is the wholetwo is a part.... 3 is a part Now can you subtract one of the parts and tell the story, This time subtract the other part and tell the story.

$5 - 2 = 3$ Children need to say 5 is the whole.... 5 subtract 2 is the same as 3

$5 - 3 = 2$ Children need to say 5 is the whole.... 5 subtract 3 is the same as 2

Y2 Class 6

This week we have been exploring subtracting multiples of 10 and then subtracting a two digit amount.. We have used practical equipment to show what the numbers look like and to be able to count the total. (Use something like straws to represent tens and raisins to represent ones)

We have looked carefully at the answers. What has changed? Have the tens changed? Why/why not? Have the ones changed? Why not ?

Can your child spell/write these common exception words within a sentence that you dictate to them:

Some, beautiful, because. Then practise the following words ending in -ly: **happily, cruelly, calmly, gently, cheerfully.**

Can you think of any other words ending in the suffix -ly?

Maths

In maths the children have been learning to write the multiplication expression alongside the matching repeated addition number sentence. For example: $4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 = 5 \times 4$

Can the children write a multiplication expression to match the following repeated addition expressions?

$5 + 5 + 5 + 5$ $6 + 6$ $2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2$ $1 + 1 + 1$ $10 + 10 + 10 + 10$
