Next week the whole school will be celebrating British Science Week. We will be holding our own whole school science celebrations within school, experiencing lots of exciting science assemblies, activities, experiments and visitors.

#### <u>Numeracy</u>

Please support you child in correct number formation of numerals 0 - 9. They can record this in their homework book or carry out practically using chalks, paints, water brushes, glitter trays etc.
