Personal Social & Emotional Development: Help your grown up with the laundry, can you sort the washing into darks, colours and whites? help them load the washing machine and peg out the laundry to dry.

Physical Development: Draw 3 animals which you saw at the farm.

Communication & Language: Play a game with members of your family. Take turns to make different animal noises. Who can guess the most animal noises wins the game.

Literacy

Please also recap our tricky words 'I, the, go, no, into, he, we' please practise reading these words and even have a go at spelling them - maybe they could be a secret password

Maths

Please continue playing bunny ears using numbers within 10. Think about different ways of partitioning a number eg 8, could be 7 and 1, 4 and 4, 5 and 3, 8 and 0. You can use pasta shapes or counters to support the children's understanding.
