This week our children are shining showing our school value Teamwork.

This term we have had many opportunities to work together for the greater good including team work at the sporting festival and also at the 80's fitness fundraising challenge.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check Workshops for Parents

A huge thank you to the parents/carers who attended our Year 1 Phonics Screen Check workshops. The morning and after-school sessions were both well-attended. It was wonderful to hear our families joining in with Fred talk and learning the phonics strategies that we teach in school. Our mantra to support decoding word reading is "Special friends, Fred talk, read the word." The positive comments we received were greatly appreciated. The session's slides will be sent out to all Year 1 parents. Due to the positive feedback, we are hoping to put on an extra session after Easter. We have offered out Phonics Breakfast Booster sessions to children that we have assessed as benefitting from an extra focussed group. The national pass score has been 32 out of 40 words decoding marks in recent years so we are working toward this and beyond. We will be informing families individually with invitations to Phonics Breakfast Booster Clubs for Summer 1 term.











Whistlestop Valley Railway



This week class 5, 6, & 10 visited the Whistlestop Valley Railway. We were greeted by our train driver and guard. Then we travelled on 'Sian' from Clayton West Station to Shelley Station. We saw some very picturesque views on our travels; we spotted horses, calves and cows, Elmey Moor Mass and travelled through an extremely dark tunnel!

Thank you to Matilda, Juniper, Eldon & Leo for helping the guard to turn Sian the steam train on the turntable at Shelley so we could travel back to Clayton West.

During our visit the guards spoke to us about how a steam engine works building on our knowledge of the 'Father of the Railways' George Stephenson. We sketched the train and carriages in our art books before travelling on the miniature railway train. The staff at Whistlestop Valley commented "your pupils were a joy to have on site and a credit to your school".







This experience and comments from the organisation make me very proud indeed. I would also like to thank parent volunteers for your time, care and commitment to school – I know it was a very tiring day!



Thank you to all parents and carers that are supporting good attendance of 90%+

If your child has less than 90% attendance it is categorised as 'persistence absence' at 50% is categorised as 'severe absence'. You will be sent a letter to alert you and to offer support. If your

child's attendance declines further, you will be invited into school for a meeting to discuss how support might improve your child's attendance. If this continues the Local Authority will issue with an official 'Notice to Improve' and proceed with the Rotherham SAMP process. You can view your current attendance on Arbor.



Reporting Illnesses

07:45-08:30am Now available to book on Arbor up until Summer! Please note that places are available to book as a **block booking payment. F2-Y2** (under consultation)

During this session children can enjoy a varied choice of breakfast food and drink. Daily cost includes a choice of food and drinks. During this special time before school children enjoy games, crafts and sports with their friends and are well supported by our happy, caring adults.



We are pleased to be able to move forward with our wraparound care offer which will be implemented in stages during the forthcoming months. The wraparound offer criteria is not yet available to FS1 children. We are able to offer a breakfast club initially to a raised number of 30 pupils (F2-Y2) from 7:45-8:30am with a block extended booking. We aim to make the breakfast club available from 7:30am in due course, available for block whole year booking. This is in support of the Government agenda for working families.



Think 'Pharmacy First'

GP practices are busy and it can be difficult to get a same-day GP appointment. When your child is off sick from school with any of the above conditions, by going straight to your local pharmacy you can have a consultation with a trained clinical professional and receive advice and even medication if it is needed, meaning they could be on the road to recovery and back at school as soon as possible.





The APP hosts important information around school readiness, child development, healthy life styles, sleep health, SEND support and much more.





What is cyberbullying?

Cyberbullying is any form of bullying that is carried out through the use of electronic media devices, such as computers, laptops, smartphones, tablets, or gaming consoles

Impact of cyberbullying

- It can be anonymous, so the victim does not know who is sending the messages.
- It can occur 24/7 as the perpetrator can target the individual out of school and during holidays
- Hurtful posts or messages can be seen by others as these can be shared on social media or group messaging apps.
- Sometimes the posts can remain onsite for long periods of time.

Types of cyberbullying

Impersonation - Create a false profile or Impersonate someone the victim may know

Humiliation - spread rumours and/or edit images

Flaming – sending vulgar, aggressive comments to start a fight

Sharing Private Images - sharing private/embarrassing messages

Daxxing - Researching and broadcast private information.

Signs my child may be being cyberbullied

- They can be withdrawn or showing signs that they are depressed.
- There is a reluctance from them to use technology e.g. smartphone, games console
- They easily become aggressive when they are confronted with issues.
- In the worst case scenario, they might be selfharming or use illicit substances.

As a parent, what can I do?

It is important to have a regular digital dialogue with your child about their online life. If they are being cyberbullied, look at the following:

- Look at BLOCKING the account of the individual who is sending or posting messages
- messages
 Many apps, social networks and gaming platforms have a REPORTING system which you can use to report the cyberbullying.

You may also want to talk to your child's school about the issue.
