## **FS 1 Happy Home Learning**

### **Reading**

Please read with your child at least 3 times a week or more, please record your reading in your child's home/school diary.

### **Physical**

Shoulder spirals– Hold out both your arms at shoulder height. From your fingertips, make small circle shapes, starting small and getting bigger until you can make big spiral shapes.

Please keep practising writing your name with the correct formation using your name card. Make sure you are holding your pencil with a comfortable grip (this activity is not for the Blue PM team)

### **Number**

This week we have been learning all about number 10. Using your recycling materials at home make a rocket using yoghurt pots/ boxes/ tubes. Then enjoy counting down from 10 to 0 to blast off your rocket.


