#### Grapes in Packed Lunches

We would like to remind parents that if your child has grapes in their lunch box they **should always** be cut in half from top to bottom lengthways to prevent the possibility of choking.

We have been advised by health colleagues that grapes should always be cut lengthwise so they can pass more easily through smaller throats. Never slice width wise because they are still big enough to choke on. You should slice them downwards in half and cut them lengthwise again into quarters.

#### **Maths**
