Reminder: Nut Allergies

Thank you to all parent and carers for helping us to keep children safe by not bringing nuts or nut products into school. We have a number of children with a serious nut allergy that can be fatal. Can you please ensure that you **DO NOT** send any food into school that contains nuts for example peanut butter, Snicker/Racer bars, Nutella etc. Thank you for your understanding.

Happy Home Learning

Personal, Social & Emotional Development: As part of transition and preparing for being school ready we would like you to practice getting dressed all by yourself including fastening buttons and zips.

Physical Development: This week we have been learning all about movement. Choose a piece of music and teach a dance to a family member.

Numerical Pattern: Using lolly sticks or twigs from the garden, can you make the following shapes, a square, a rectangle, a triangle, a pentagon and a hexagon.

Literacy & Numerical Pattern: To continue your learning about shapes can you play 'Guess the shape' with a family member or friend. Describe the shape remembering to say how many sides and corners it has and be specific "it has 4 sides, it has 4 corners, it has 4 sides that are equal can your friend or family member guess your shapes correctly.

FS2 Homework

As part of our 'Picture This' project we are having a focus on art and movement. As part of this we have been learning a dance from 'Moana' and looking at the movement of bodies. Please encourage your child to take part in a dance sequence and talk about the movements and the flow. You can use familiar songs such as 'The Hokey Cokey' and 'I'm a little tea pot'. Talk about the differences in speed and style of the movements and ask your child to perform for you. We'd love to see some video clips or photographs on our ClassDojo.

Class 6, 9 and 10 Homework

Spellings Y1 – go going good turn, hurt, church, burst, Thursday. Can you think of any other words with the 'ur' sound in?

Spellings Y2 - because again other every once

Practise the above common exception words and put them into full sentences.

Maths Y1

This week we have been working with multiples of ten and solving problems involving counting in tens. Please practise counting in tens, forwards and backwards.

Maths Y2

This week we have been adding and subtracting a single digit number to/from a two digit number. Consider what happens to the tens and what happens to the ones. Can you use your knowledge of number facts when you add/subtract

e.g $24 + 4 = \underline{\quad}$ If I know $4 + 4 = 8$ then I know $24 + 4 = 28$

e.g $36 - 2 = \underline{\quad}$ If I know $6 - 2 = 4$ then I know $36 - 2 = 34$

Now try some addition and subtraction calculations of your own

Maths

Spend time to develop your mathematical fluency with quick fire number facts within 20. Include addition, subtraction facts, doubles and near doubles.

E.g. $7+8$ $9+9$ $14-7$ $12-5$ $7+6$ $11+5$
