However, many families do not realise that they may still qualify for benefit related free meals (pupil premium) If awarded, your child will have the opportunity to enjoy a **free school meal, free educational visits, free after school clubs and many other activities which take place throughout the school and normally involve payment.**

Happy Home Learning

Personal Social Emotional Development: Help your grown up's – carry out a busy job whilst enjoying some fresh air in the garden, choose from weeding, sweeping, planting. Which jobs will you choose?

Physical Development: Using recycling materials make a bus. This week we have been learning the rhyme the Wheels on the Bus. Enjoy creating a bus and singing the rhyme with your family.

Communication & Language: Play a listening and drawing game with a grown up. Take it in turns to sound out a word and then the other person has to draw the item. e.g. sun, hat, pan, box.

FS2 Homework

Literacy

This week we have been focusing on writing simple sentences and using a full stop. Please support your child to write simple 'I can' sentences using the sounds they know eg I can jog, I can skip, I can run fast, I can jump high. Children can record this in their homework books and draw a picture.

Maths

In maths, we have been continuing to work on number bonds and thinking of different ways to make a given number. Please play "Bunny Ears" as a warm up and then think about different number facts for numbers within 10 eg 3 and 3 make 6, 4 and 2 make 6, 5 and 1 make 6. Children can record their answers by drawing representations eg 3 red smarties and 3 green, 4 blue smarties and 2 yellow.

Can you tell your grown up what Mrs Grinling's plan was and think of your own plan to stop the seagulls from stealing the food. Write it down in your homework book.
