Online Safety - The World Record Chat – Whatsapp group

We have received information regarding a large scale whatsapp group called 'The World Record Chat' which is adding young people to the group chat. This group contains over 900 members and includes adults and children and we are aware of young people in Years 5 and 6 who have been recently added. This group has members who are posting explicit, pornographic images and GIFs and are using indecent and inappropriate language including sexual, discriminatory, racist and homophobic language as well as encouraging self-harm. They are asking questions of children about their age and where they live.

Attached to this newsletter is an information sheet to help safeguard young people online. It is advised to talk to young people about who they are interacting with online, encourage them to talk about their online world and remind them of the dangers of speaking to people online who they do not know in real life.

Maths

Y1- This week we have been counting forwards and backwards in tens. We have used practical equipment to make tens and to add/subtract ten. Can your child answer questions such as 'What is ten more than 20?' 'What is ten fewer than 60?' $30 + 10 = \underline{\quad}$ $70 - 10 = \underline{\quad}$ Try some of your own.

Y2 class 6- This week we have made and counted groups of five. We have recorded our groupings in pictures and using multiplication equations. Can you make some groups of five. How many groups do you have? What is the product? Describe your grouping in words and as an equation e.g I made three groups of five, Five ten fifteen, three groups of five are fifteen $3 \times 5 = 15$ I have 3 five times and that is 15.

Class 7 and Class 8 Homework

Spellings: Common exception words - **door even every everybody eye father find**

Use the 'Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check' method. If you can spell them without looking, have a go at putting some of these words into a sentence.

Maths

We have continued to use the multiplication facts from the two, five, and ten times tables to solve division calculations. For example: To solve $6 \div 2 = \underline{\quad}$, children have been skip counting in twos until they get to six (the dividend) to find the answer. Can you solve the following division equations using skip counting?

$14 \div 2 = \underline{\quad}$

$45 \div 5 = \underline{\quad}$

$60 \div 10 = \underline{\quad}$

$18 \div 2 = \underline{\quad}$

$20 \div 5 = \underline{\quad}$
