Hay fever Medication in School



As hay fever season approaches, we want to remind you of our school's policies regarding the administration of hay fever medication during school hours.

All hay fever medication must be provided to the school in its original pharmacy-dispensed container with the prescriber's label attached (including medicines bought over the counter). Pharmacies can do this for you.

Also, the medicine has to have been taken at home for a period of 24 hours before being administered at school and all necessary school paperwork has been completed.

Reading

Keep reading your school texts little and often. Your child will be taking their phonic screen check/ retake next week so please use the links sent through previously on class do-jo to keep practising these sounds which are often the ones children find most tricky to spot in words.

Spellings

YR2 Class 6- Please check your child can spell the above words. Then try any many who whole people

Maths

Y1- We have been counting amounts in tens and ones. Use something small like raisins pasta pieces. Grab an amount. How many tens can you make? How many extra ones are there? Children to describe what they have 'I have made 2 tens and 5 extra ones. This is 25

YR2 Class 6- We have used money this week to support our work on the 2, 5 and ten times table. Choose an amount of twos. Count it to find the product. Now tell the story. I have five twos $5 \times 2 = 10$ five groups of two is ten or 2 times by 5 is 10. Make some stories with 5p and 10p coins.

Class 7 and Class 8 Homework

Spellings - half hold hour improve kind any many

Learn the spellings using Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check. Write sentences including the words in context.

Maths – Recall halving facts of even numbers up to 24. Remember when we halve, it is the same as dividing by 2. Therefore the two times tables can help if you're unsure.

E.g. half of 12 = 6
