### FS2 Homework

#### Literacy

In Literacy this week we have been concentrating hard on writing simple sentences. Write 3 simple sentences about what you enjoyed the most at the Jubilee picnic.

Eg. I liked the games.

I liked the buns.

I liked the dancing.

(It is very important to allow your child to listen to the sounds in words themselves and write them down. Here is an example of what it might look like - I lict the gams. I liked the games).

Remind your child of how to write the tricky red words **I** and **the**.

#### Maths

Write a number line in your homework book from 0 to 10. Look at the number line and ask your child probing mathematical questions.

Eg. 1 more than 9 is?

1 less than 2 is?

Is 5 bigger than 3?

Is 3 fewer than 6?

#### Maths-

Stop at various points in the day and see if you can tell your grown-up the time.

Have a go at drawing a clock and see if you can draw on the correct hands for the following times, twenty-five past 2, quarter past 3, five past 5 and twenty past 6.

### **Literacy-**

We are so excited for our trip to York chocolate story on Tuesday. Whilst we are there, we will get chance to ask lots of questions about chocolate, yum! Write down some questions that you wish to ask whilst we are there e.g. Where does cocoa come from? When was the first chocolate bar available to buy? How many different varieties of chocolate bars are there?
