We have been contacted by the Local Authority regarding a community complaint on Linden Avenue. 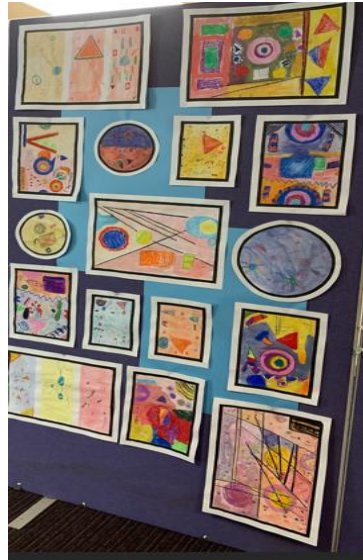
Year 2 Leavers' Assembly: Friday 11th July

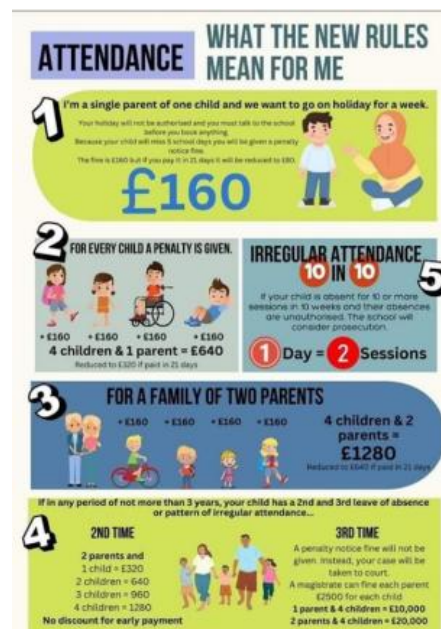
Please note that ALL term-time holidays are classed as unauthorised.

Please also be reminded that any late arrival (after registers have closed) is recorded as an 'Unauthorised Absence' so please make every effort to arrive at school before the registers are closed at **9:15am**.

Thank you to all parents and carers that are supporting good attendance. If your child has less than 90% attendance it is categorised as 'persistence absence' at 50% is categorised as 'severe absence'.

When your child's attendance reaches 92%, you will be sent a letter to alert you and to offer support in order to prevent this dropping further to 90%. If your child's attendance declines further, you will be invited into school for a meeting to discuss how support might improve your child's attendance. If this continues the Local Authority will issue with an official 'Notice to Improve' and proceed with the Rotherham SAMP process. You can view your current attendance on Arbor.

Spotlight Days

Watch out for our 'Spotlight Day' coming up in Summer Term! Our Spotlight Days encourage and celebrate 100% attendance. All children that are in school on this special day will receive an exciting surprise!

Punctuality

Phonics lessons starts at 8:45am so arriving at school on time is crucial. We conduct routine register checks each day. At the end of the half term, if we feel that your child's punctuality is a concern, we will issue you a letter to offer further support for improvement.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about MAKING FRIENDS ONLINE

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

In today's digital world, it's increasingly common for children to form friendships with people they've never met in person. While online connections can offer children a sense of belonging, they also carry significant risks. Around 19% of children aged 10 to 15 in England and Wales have chatted online with someone they've never met face to face. This guide offers expert advice for parents and educators on helping children navigate online friendships safely.

ONLINE GROOMING THREATS

Predators can use games, chat apps or social media platforms to build relationships with children and gain their trust. This may quickly develop into grooming or exploitation. Between April 2017 and March 2022, UK police recorded nearly 34,000 online grooming offences – an 82% increase in just five years.

EXPOSURE TO INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

Children may encounter distressing or explicit material while interacting with online contacts – especially via TikTok, Instagram or Snapchat. This is evidenced in a survey by the Children's Commissioner for England, which found that 45% of children aged 8 to 17 had seen content online that made them feel uncomfortable, scared or upset.

PRIVACY AND DATA RISKS

Children and young people often overshare personal details – such as where they live or go to school – without understanding the consequences. In fact, 4.4% of 10 to 17-year-olds in the UK have met up in real life with someone they'd only spoken to online.

COMPROMISED PERSONAL SAFETY

Meeting an online 'friend' in real life does place a child in serious danger. From sex workers to scammers, the consequences can be devastating. Reports of children being harmed after such meetings are becoming increasingly common in the UK, highlighting the need for safeguarding interventions.

PSYCHOLOGICAL DISTRESS

Online harm – such as cyberbullying, grooming or exposure to disturbing content – can lead to long-term emotional issues, including anxiety, depression and PTSD. 'Grooming' gangs, who threaten to release social information about a person unless they pay them money, have reportedly targeted children as young as 10, leading them to be bullied and abused.

LONG-TERM REPERCUSSIONS

Children engaged in harmful online relationships early on may develop unhealthy beliefs about relationships, consent, or self-worth. In a recent case, a 25-year-old posed as a girl on Snapchat to befriend children aged 10 to 15, manipulating them into sexual activity and resulting profound emotional distress. Due to her age and ongoing ability to evade, highlighting the long-term psychological harm online friendships with strangers can cause.

Advice for Parents & Educators

TEACH SAFE ONLINE HABITS

Help children understand how to use privacy settings, protect their personal information, spot fake profiles, and report anything suspicious or concerning. Encourage them to think critically about what they share – and whom they're talking to.

KEEP CONVERSATIONS OPEN

Let children know they can talk to you about their online life. Avoid reacting with anger or judgement, as this may prevent them from opening up in the future. A child who feels listened to is more likely to disclose problems before they escalate.

ENCOURAGE REAL-WORLD CONNECTIONS

Support children in building friendships through school, clubs, hobbies and activities in the real world. Strong offline relationships help reduce children's reliance on online platforms for social interaction, and can help them develop resilience and social confidence.

USE PARENTAL CONTROLS

Parental control settings on devices, games and apps can help manage screen time, filter out inappropriate content, and monitor activity. While no system is perfect, they provide a valuable layer of protection as children explore digital spaces.

Online Safety

The internet plays a crucial role in development of young people's identities and relationships and it can provide valuable opportunities.



It's important to remember the positives as well as looking at the risks.

What are the risks and opportunities

Key questions to help young people make safe choices online:

What might I see?

What am I sharing? Who can see it?

Who am I talking to? Do I know them?

Is what I see online real or fake?

Is something upsetting me online?

How can you help young people stay safe online?

Talk to young people - remember the positives

- Ask questions - if it's something you haven't heard of before ask them to show you how it works and what they enjoy about it
- Reassure them – show you are interested in their online lives
- Use the opportunity – to remind them about staying safe

Use practical ways - the best way to protect your child is to use multiple forms

- Internet Filtering – can done through your internet router or service provider
- Privacy Settings – you can set these in the individual apps under settings
- Parental controls – these typically control the websites that a child can visit or how long they can use devices for, usually found under device settings
- Location Settings – Built into operating systems on smartphones but are often a feature of popular apps.

NCDV FREE & FAST EMERGENCY CIVIL INJUNCTIONS QUICK GUIDE

NCDV specialise in Non-Molestation Orders.

Occupation & Prohibited Steps can be obtained as additional Orders.

Non-Molestation	• Stops violence, threats, intimidation and/or encouraging others • Stops Offender coming within 100 metres from the home • Stops Offender contacting victim • Can last up to 12 months or longer
Occupation	• Helps get a victim back into their home • Gets an Offender out of the home
Prohibited Steps	• Children at risk? • Prohibits removal of child from a parent's care • Prohibits change of name, removing from school, taking abroad

FAQs

Who can apply?	Family members/relations, married or civil partnership, engaged, couples who have/do live together, shared parental responsibilities, anyone in a relationship of significant duration (about 3 months)
Bail, DVPN/Os	Still refer. Bail may not cover all that the injunction does and we may still obtain an Order where there is a DVPN/O. Call NCDV
Last Incident?	Get an emergency injunction if the last incident was less than 10 days ago. Even if the last incident was more than 10 days ago we can still help.

POLICE ONLY: Breach? Is there an Order?
