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Happy Home Learning Foundation Stage 1

This week as part of our phonics learning, we have been on a listening walk. Can you go on a listening walk with your family? You could go around your house or outside with your family practising listening to all the different sounds you can hear. Talk about what sounds you have heard. Did you recognise all the sounds? Were they loud or quiet sounds? Were they long or short sounds? Also, continue to learn how to put on your own coat and shoes and which colour team you are in.

FS2 Homework

Literacy

This week we have been continuing to learn how to rhyme. Look around the house and pick some simple items eg. A mat. Find a rhyming word that rhymes with mat. eg. Mat – bat. Really emphasise the ending of the word that is the same sound. Continue with other rhyming words. Draw the rhyming items in your homework book.

Number

We have been learning to write numbers from 0 – 4. Practise writing these numbers in your homework book. Please make sure you are using the correct number formation. (These can be found in your home school diary on page 43 - number formation snakes).

Y1 and Y2 Homework

Spellings

Y1 common exception words;

You could write these words down in different colours in your homework books, write them in chalks outside or draw them with your finger on your grown-ups back.

Y2 common exception words;

any many clothes who

Words with a 'ge' sound; age village huge strange change

What **mystery spellings** could there be? i.e other words that have this 'ge' sound. How many can you think of?

Y1 Maths:

Next week we will be looking at time. During the day talk about the time paying particular attention to o'clock times, discuss what you do as a family at different parts of the day. If you get chance, you could draw pictures of what you do at different times.

Y2 Maths:

Practise counting backwards from **any** number between 30 and 40. Practise mental recall of number bonds for all numbers up to 10 so that you can quickly and fluently answer calculations such as....

4 + 2 6 + 1 7 + 3 5 + 2 4 + 4 etc


