## Rotherham Healthy Holidays

Rotherham Healthy Holidays is funded by the Department for Education's Holiday Activity and Food Programme. The aim of the programme is to make funded places available to eligible children from Foundation Stage 2 to Year 11.



Rotherham Healthy Holidays partner with a range of organisation across the borough over the Easter, Summer, and Winter school holidays to deliver the Holiday Activity and Food Programme. Each programme will last at least 4 hours a day over 4

days at Easter and Winter and 16 days over Summer.

At each programme children will take part in enriching activities, physical activity and receive a healthy meal. The programme offers funded places to those who are eligible and aged from Foundation Stage 2 to Year 11. Some providers also offer good valued paid places.



**Y2 – Class 6 - I is has poor eye** race ice city face fancy What other words have the soft 'c' sound?


## Maths
