Department for Education coronavirus (COVID-19) helpline

The Department for Education coronavirus (COVID-19) helpline is available to answer questions about coronavirus (COVID-19) relating to education and children's social care. Staff, parents and young people can contact this helpline by calling:

Opening hours: Monday to Friday from 8am to 6pm

Saturday and Sunday from 10am to 4pm

In order to keep everyone safe, we must insist on the following...

- Arrival and collection times must be adhered to. Parents must not enter the school grounds until their drop off time / pick up time.
- Use the allocated entrance only
- Only one adult to accompany children on to the site (younger siblings who cannot be left at home can accompany you)
- All children must stay with their adult and not play on the school grounds or equipment
- All adults and children must follow the social distancing markers and one-way systems
- Adults will drop children off at the cloakroom doors, where a member of staff will be there to welcome the children into school.
- Adults must not congregate on the school grounds or at the school gates.
- All enquiries to school to be made via telephone or email wherever possible. You will still be able to communicate with staff via the teachers' emails

Year 2 to 3 Transfers 2021

Letters have now been sent from the Rotherham Borough Council to the home addresses of all Year 2 children advising parents that you can now apply for Year 3 places for September 2021 admission.

The parents of any child who lives outside the Rotherham Authority will need to apply via their home authority.
