Y1 Spellings of the week- I you we can When you know how to spell the words try to spell them in a simple sentences e.g I can run. We can hop. You can sit. tc


Y1 Maths We have continued to at whole amounts and parts of a whole. Use some practical objects to make a whole amount e.g 5 Draw your whole amount of objects. Now identify a part e.g 3 and draw a circle around the part . Can your child say 'The whole is 5' '3 is a part' '2 is a part'

Y2 Cass 6 Spellings of the week - Please check your child can spell the y1 spellings first. If so, then move onto these ... **could would** knock know knee knight knife

Y2 Class 6 Maths

We are continuing to work on place value. This week we have been partitioning two digit numbers. Can you make a two digit number with your straws and raisins. Now partition it into tens and ones. You can record it like this 34



34 is made of 30 and 4 $34 = 30 + 4$
