### **In order to keep everyone safe, we must insist on the following...**

- Arrival and collection times must be adhered to. Parents must not enter the school grounds until their drop off time / pick up time.
- Use the allocated entrance only
- Only one adult to accompany children on to the site (younger siblings who cannot be left at home can accompany you)
- All children must stay with their adult and not play on the school grounds or equipment
- All adults and children must follow the social distancing markers and one-way systems
- Adults will drop children off at the cloakroom doors, where a member of staff will be there to welcome the children into school.
- Adults must not congregate on the school grounds or at the school gates.
- All enquiries to school to be made via telephone or email wherever possible. You will still be able to communicate with staff via the teachers' emails

### Confirmation of Self-isolation dates

If you received a letter on Monday or Wednesday this week asking your child to self-isolate for 14 days, I can confirm that the isolation period for your child will end on Friday 23<sup>rd</sup> October. Your child can resume routine activities from Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> October (as long as they have not developed symptoms themselves). Your child will return to school on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> November. (Please note, Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November 2020 is an INSET Day and open to staff only).

# flu: 5 reasons to vaccinate your child

- 1. Protect your child.** The vaccine will help protect your child against flu and serious complications such as bronchitis and pneumonia
- 2. Protect you, your family and friends.** Vaccinating your child will help protect more vulnerable family and friends
- 3. No injection needed.** The nasal spray is painless and easy to have
- 4. It's better than having flu.** The nasal spray helps protect against flu, has been given to millions of children worldwide and has an excellent safety record
- 5. Avoid costs.** If your child gets flu, you may have to take time off work or arrange alternative childcare

**What should I do?**

Contact your child's GP if your child was aged two or three years old (on the 31 August of the current flu season) and you haven't heard from them by early November.	If your child is at primary school or in year 7 of secondary school, the school will send you a leaflet and consent form. Please sign the form and return it.	If your child has a health condition that puts them at greater risk from flu, or lives with someone on the NHS Shielded Patient List, they can get the flu vaccine from their GP.
