#### **Curriculum**

In Geography, Y2 children have been working towards answering our enquiry question: 'Is Wickersley a good place to visit?'



Over the course of the half -term, children have been learning about the human and physical features of the landscape and planned the route for the field-trip using compass directions to visit the places they believe make Wickersley an exciting place to visit. They also canvassed the opinion of local residents as to why they thought Wickersley was a good place to live and how it could be improved in order to collect data from different sources with a different viewpoint. After half-term, the children will next be drawing up a series of guestions to survey parents about their views of Wickersley - so watch this space!



The children benefitted hugely from applying their Geography learning in a first-hand experience and were delighted to have time together to explore the local area and prove that Wickersley Woods, the Tanyard and Wickersley Park make Wickersley an exciting place to visit.
