Parent Consultation Week



The Service of Remembrance on Sunday 12th November will be a chance for residents to pay their respects to the men and women of Bramley from both world wars and other conflicts. It is also a

chance to give thanks to the many service personnel who have kept our country safe over the years.

There will be a service in St Francis Church at 10 am conducted by Rev John Hibberd.

This will be followed at 10.40 am by a parade to the War Memorial lead by Bramley Brass Band when the names of the War Dead will be read out.

Wreaths will be laid by civic leaders and representatives from village groups. Everyone is welcome in church after the service for light refreshments.

Mrs Smith will be in attendance, any children attending would be welcome to lay our School wreath at the Cenotaph. Please come and say 'Hello' to Mrs Smith at the service.

<u>Infection Control Update</u>

We are currently experiencing a high number of children with sickness, vomiting and high temperatures. We have informed the Local Authority and Public Health England of the current levels.

In order to try and reduce the spread of infection in school we have undertaken the following...

- Additional deep cleans of areas including all surfaces, carpets, toilets and pinch points (light switches, door handles, push bars etc). We will continue to put in place enhanced cleaning.
- Regular handwashing throughout the day
- Respiratory hygiene practices with children ('catch it, kill it, bin it' method used to dispose of dirty tissues)
- Daily fruit is given out by staff (rather than children helping themselves from a class bowl / basket)
- No baking activities in school currently
- Playdough will not be used currently
- Ventilation in all classrooms

We continue to enforce the 48-hour rule for any children with sickness and / or diarrhoea; all children must stay at home for 48 hours from the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea.

If your child is experiencing any of these symptoms and you are concerned about them, please contact your GP for further advice.

E - Safety Information for Parent(s)/Carer - DIGITAL FAMILY TIME



It is important that parents explore new technology with their children. Here are some useful tips to develop digital family time.

1 SET RULES

Parents should ensure that there are family rules about the time their children spend online, which parts of the house they can use their devices and what they can download onto their device.

2 EXPLORE TECH TOGETHER

One of the most important ways you can support your child's digital journey is to sit down with them regularly and get them to show you what games or apps they are using.

3 BALANCE SCREENTIME

Children love using technology, but we must not stop this from enjoying other pastimes. Ensure that you set limits on how long they can use their devices and look at other activities which takes them away from their screens.

4 DIGITAL DIALOGUE

Parents need to ensure that they have a regular digital dialogue with their children to ensure that they are aware of what they are doing. If parents can do this whilst their children are young, it will hopefully lead to more understanding as they got older.

Thank you for continuing to support your child's regular attendance.

Spotlight on Punctuality

It is important that your child attends school every day and on time. Arriving late to school is unsettling for children and disrupts the start to their day. Did you know that 10 minutes late every day = 33 hours lost learning each year?

The easiest way to ensure your child attends school on time every day is to establish a GOOD EVENING AND MORNING ROUTINE. If mornings are hectic in your household, prepare as much as possible the night before. The school day starts at 8.30am, so please ensure your child arrives on time. If your child arrives after this time, then you must take your child to the Main School Office to sign them in late. These late procedures are in place so that every child is entered onto the register correctly and can be accounted for in the event of an emergency.

Tips to help you get to school on time everyday

- Make sure your child understands why school is important
- Show your child that you are interested in what they have done at school
- Get everything ready the night before school
- Arrange appointments before or after school or during the school holidays
- Set your alarm and your child's alarm clock, see who can beat the clock!
- Join Breakfast Club
- Set off a little bit earlier to school


