FS2/RECEPTION

Our Learning

What a wonderful and exciting first month back at school we have had; such a lovely and positive start to the new year. This month we have introduced our new learning topic '999, There's been an Emergency! The children have thrived in the numerous role play opportunities. We have enjoyed a number of visitors from people who support us in our community including a Paramedic, Doctor, Nurse, Police Officer and Lollipop Lady. Children have listened and have thought hard about appropriate questions to ask to find out even more about their job. One of the highlights was getting to see inside of an ambulance! The children explored the vehicle and looked closely at the different pieces of equipment carried inside. Our visitor-Paramedic Nathan explained what each item is used for and how it helps keep people safe and cared for. The children asked lots of thoughtful questions and showed great curiosity and enthusiasm. The children were especially excited to see a Police Officer and Police Car up close. They learned about some of the tools police officers use in their daily work and how these help them to communicate "Walkie talkies are like radios they ask for help" (Callum U3) "Police Officers keep us safe, we can go to them when we are lost" (Elodie U3). The children listened carefully and confidently shared their ideas, showing a growing understanding of the police officer's role. These experiences helped the children develop their understanding of the important role emergency workers play in our community, while also supporting their learning through real-life experiences. It sparked lots of discussion, new vocabulary, and imaginative play back in the classroom. As part of our learning about Fire Fighters the children explored the role they play, learned about fire engines, protective clothing, and the different jobs firefighters do. To build on this learning, the children created their own fact files, using pictures, labels, and simple sentences to share what they had discovered. These fact files will be sent to our local library, giving the children a real purpose for their writing and a sense of pride in sharing their learning with the wider community. We have been so impressed with the children's engagement and interest, what a fantastic way to bring our topic to life!





YEAR 1

Our Learning

Year 1 have been very eager to get back to their learning this Spring term and have dived straight into the curriculum for this term!

We are so proud of how the children's independence is growing each week, they are now getting changed in record time and are taking ownership of their belongings.

Across the three classes, it is evident that our current Computing topic has been one the children have been looking forward to. Using the BeeBots, the children have been exploring the world of commands and programming, there has been some excellent team-work on show during these sessions. Well done everybody!

In RE, the children have showed great enthusiasm towards learning about Shabbat and Passover. The children planned their own Seder meal and were thoroughly interested in learning how Jewish people celebrate Passover with their families. We all really enjoyed discussing and sharing our current knowledge on celebrations across different cultures and religions!

Class 5, 6 and 10 have really enjoyed delving into our new Science topic 'Amazing Animals' we have been so pleasantly surprised with how many interesting facts the children already know around this subject. I think we have some passionate future zookeepers on our hands.

In History, the children have started to work towards answering our enquiry question 'How has transport changed over time?'. There has been some really interesting discussions taking place and are beginning to use the new vocabulary that they are being exposed to in History sessions!

YEAR 2

Our Learning

Year 2 have had a busy start to the new year and have hit the ground running across the curriculum. It has been wonderful to get outside to explore living and non-living things in Science. Please continue to ask your child how they know whether an object is 'living', 'dead' or 'never lived'. We're sure they will surprise you with their scientific knowledge of living and non-living things! The children have also been fully emersed in our History topic of The Great Fire of London. It will be brilliant to bring this significant event to life in our upcoming drama event. In Geography Year 2 have been excitedly diving into their brand-new atlases, recently purchased by Mrs Searson, to develop their growing geography skills. The children have been learning to identify the seven continents and five oceans, using the maps to spot patterns, compare places, and ask brilliant geographical questions. Be sure to test their knowledge! Children in Year 2 have happily welcomed back the sight of the BeeBots in Computing this Spring term. The children have been very enthusiastic towards giving sequences and commands to one another and have carried over their previous knowledge from last year to support them with creating different algorithms to program a sequence on the BeeBots! It has been very impressive to watch this process and the confidence on display when operating the floor robots.
