We have extended our thinking and supported our community and the wider world by participating in a variety of celebrations including Remembrance Day, Bonfire Night and Diwali. We have thought about others through participating in Odd Sock Day in support of anti-bullying and Children in Need. We have had visitors from our local community including the road safety team, Wickersley Library, our friends from Church and 'Open the Book', and of course a very special visit from one of our children talking about and raising awareness for diabetes. We also enjoyed using our phonic knowledge to spot and spell some rhyming words during the Michael Rosen Day.

Declan said his favorite part our learning this term was reading Owl Babies and making our own owl pictures. Arlo, agreed saying he loved drawing the owls and adding in the detail on the feathers! Ari loved playing with the baby owls especially Baby Bill "Who always wants his Mummy!".

**CLASS 5,6,10 - Year 1** 

Year 1 have enjoyed a visit to Wickersley Library this month, the librarian Kirsty showed us round and explained all the different activities and books available at the Library. Kirsty read us a lovely story. She gave us a registration form to fill in so we can all become members of the Library. We are looking forward to visiting again soon.

As part of our History learning, we are exploring toys from the past and comparing them with the toys we enjoy today. We have enjoyed bringing our favorite toys from home to share with our friends. The lovely Ellie from Clifton Park Museum came to school to share toys from the past with us and we explored how they work. We enjoyed exploring the Spinning Top, Tumbling Towers, Pop Gun, Puppets and much more.

To consolidate our Geography topic about our local area, we walked around Bramley observing what we could see, hear and smell to bring our classroom learning to life. This gave our children the opportunity to demonstrate what they had learnt and make meaningful contributions to answer our enquiry question – what is our local area like?

We had a visitor who came into our assembly to discuss the importance of road safety. The children were excellent at pointing out what it means to be safe by busy roads and what to do when we need to cross them. Our visitor also brought in lots of useful props, to allow us to showcase what we had learnt on a simulated 'busy road' on a pedestrian crossing in our school hall. This also gave us the chance to demonstrate our skills and talk about how to keep ourselves and others safe.
