


Impact of the Sports Premium Grant

Aim 1- To increase staff confidence and improve quality of teaching and learning in PE and School Sport.

- A staff questionnaire and evidence trail established a starting point for planning the spending of the Sports Premium Grant. This highlighted areas in which staff felt least confident and areas for CPD.
- Teaching staff in KS1 have now received CPD covering the following blocks; gymnastics, matball/ball skills, SAQ (speed, agility, quickness), badminton, boccia, rounders, football, cheerleading and indoor athletics from both Live and Learn Sports and Wickersley School and Sports College and therefore the children are accessing a much wider range of physical activities and sports.
- Foundation Stage 2 staff have received CPD covering dance and gymnastics from the Head of PE at





Wickersley School and Sports College.


- Staff now have schemes of work and lesson plans for the above areas in PE.
- Evidence trails and staff feedback have shown that teachers are more confident in the teaching of new skills and sports in PE and that children are more active in each PE session. Teachers are confidently delivering higher quality lessons of at least a good standard following the CPD training.
- Resources purchased.

Aim 2- To raise the profile of Physical Education in School

- There has been a huge 'buzz' in school surrounding PE over the last academic year.
- PE and School Sport was on our whole School Development Plan to remain as a focus throughout the year.
- Non-negotiables and our plans for the development of PE were shared with parents in our 'New to year group' meetings.
- We held a competition to name our new school sports team which was promoted to parents on the school newsletter and we had over 50 fantastic entries! We decided on Bramley Sunnyside All Stars which was chosen by both Eliza Feltoe and Zara Rogers.

- We purchased a fabulous new team kit for our Bramley Sunnyside All Star sports team and revealed it to the children in assembly.
- Our school newsletter promoted children's participation in sporting events such as the inter-school competitions and workshops. It also highlighted the success of individual children.
- Children were presented with certificates in assemblies so that the whole school knew what the children had achieved.
- Children performed their dances from the Dance Festival for the children in school.
- Children identified as gifted and talented took part in a lunchtime workshop with a Rotherham United youth team coach and 3 children were selected to go on to a pre-academy youth training programme.
- All children in school including Foundation Stage 2 participated in a Rotherham Titans training session receiving certificates for their hard work.





Aim 3- To begin to develop intra-school and inter-school competition and increase participation in extra-curricular activities.

- We purchased a new sports kit for our Sports teams that children wear for both inter and intra school competitions.
- Children in year 2 participated in 3 intra-school competitions throughout the year in matball, indoor and outdoor athletics. Year 1 children participated in 1 inter school competition in indoor athletics.
- Children in year 2 participated in 3 inter- school competitions throughout the academic year; matball, indoor and outdoor athletics. This is the first time that KS1 have held inter-school competitions in the cluster!

Bramley Sunnyside All Star Winners!

- **Matball**

We hosted the first ever KS1 inter-school competition in matball at Bramley Sunnyside Infant School. We entered 3 teams into the KS1 matball festival in our cluster and came a fabulous 1st, 2nd and 3rd place! 25 children participated in this festival.



Inter school athletics Festival

- We entered 2 teams of 8 into the KS1 Indoor athletics festival at Bramley Grange Primary and again secured 1st place in the festival!
- 4 children achieved gold medals in the events, 2 silvers and 3 bronze. Wow watch out Jessica Ennis Hill!

Outdoor athletics festival

- We entered 2 teams of 10 into the outdoor athletics festival held at St Albans Primary School.
- We were successful in achieving a gold medal for the girls long jump. Well done Eleanor Brunyee! The fastest boy in the sprint and the distance run, WOW Charlie Brittain! Also we achieved fastest girl in the sprint race, super speedy Logan Cooke!

Dance and Movement festival

- We entered 4 teams into the Wickersely School and Sports College Dance and Movement festival. Wickersley School were a little bit surprised when we appeared with 120 children! This has increased from 30 children in the last academic year. They performed beautifully and very confidently! Miss Dawson's class performed a dance to 'Under the Sea' from The Little mermaid. Mrs Turner's children performed a cheerleading routine. Mrs Stothard's children performed a gymnastics routine to 'What the Fox says' and Miss Barr's children performed a dance to 'Roar' by Katie Perry!

90 Year 2 children attended the KS1 multi-skills festival at the English Institute of Sport. They represented Australia and took part in an opening ceremony and a sprint final race.





Over the academic year school part funded after school sports clubs with Live and Learn Sports and Beth .

The number of clubs children have access to has doubled since the previous academic year. 60 children accessed the gymnastics club. It was so popular following the children's in class gymnastics teaching that we had to repeat the gymnastics club for a further 30 children! 30 children accessed matball, football and .

The after school street dance club was also very popular. 30 KS1 children participated in the club over a 6 week period. It culminated with a performance for parents in the last week. We gave out questionnaires to parents. Parents had very positive feedback, particularly the quality of teaching and the cost of the sessions as school had part subsidised the sessions.

The first after school club for Foundation Stage 2 was also held. 25 FS2 children participated in a 4 week taster course for the Street Dance club.
