Attendance

You will have recently received a letter informing you of your child's current attendance level and there are also regular updates on the Newsletter which include class and whole school attendance level. As we approach the end of the Spring Term, the overall level of attendance for the school year to date is 95.6%, which falls below our expected level of 96%.

We are aware that illness is unavoidable and an unusually high level of winter viruses, coughs and colds have raised absence levels significantly over the last few months. However, statistics confirm that had no term time holidays been taken, our monthly targets would have been met and we would now be achieving a level of 96.6% which exceeds our expected level.

We would also remind you that Term Time holidays will not be authorised and will be marked on your child's record as unauthorised and will be referred for a Fixed Penalty Notice if it meets the criteria. Please make sure that you check your term date cards before you book any holiday. We still have a full term to make every effort to increase our attendance level and secure an acceptable level by the end of the school year.

We will continue to keep you updated of our progress with regards to attendance on our newsletters and look forward to your continued support during the remainder of the school year. Regular attendance is vital for your child's learning and we look forward to working with you over the coming weeks.
