Don't forget that next Monday (6th May) is May Day and the school will be closed

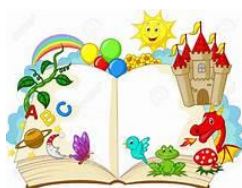
REMINDER: Year 2 SATs

As we have many children with specific dietary requirements and allergies, we are not able to accept birthday cakes to be brought into school and shared with classmates. As an alternative, your child can celebrate with their friends by sharing a story, donated especially by them! The class teacher will share the book and birthday message with the class and it will be placed in the class reading area for the children to enjoy. This is completely voluntary and not at all expected, but in response to Parental queries, should you wish to donate a book to school to mark their birthday, please collect a donation sticker from the school office and stick it in the book before bringing it into class.

Disco Nights

We are excited to inform you that we will be hosting another series of Disco Nights for all our Year 1 & Year 2 children. These will be split over three dates as follows:

Classes 5 & 6 - Thursday 9th May 3pm to 4.15pm

Classes 7 & 8 - Thursday 16th May 3pm to 4.15pm

Classes 9 & 10 - Thursday 23rd May 3pm to 4.15pm

The cost of the evening will be £3.00 per child and this will include a drink & a hotdog. Please advise your child's teacher or the school office of any dietary requirements.

Children can bring a change of clothes in a bag with their name on and be collected at 4.15pm from their class as usual.

If you would like your child to attend a disco night. **Payment should be made online via your Schoolmoney account by the day before the event.** (Wednesday 8th May for Classes 5 & 6, Wednesday 15th May for Classes 7& 8 and Wednesday 22nd May for Classes 9 & 10. **Please ensure that you give consent for your child to attend by ticking the consent box online. Without this consent your child will not be able to attend.**

Lost Property

Once more, we have a large number of school jumpers, coats and lunch boxes etc. which have been left in school. Please check that your child has all their belongings with them when you collect them from school at the end of the day and make sure that their name is clearly marked somewhere on their belongings to help staff identify their owner when they are mislaid. Any lost property not collected by Friday 24th May will be disposed.

FS1 Parents

If there are any children with any food allergies, intolerances or special dietary requirements can you please inform your child's teacher so that we can organise meetings with the school cook, parents and the LEA Catering representative before the children start in September.

Punctuality

We have seen an increase in late arrivals. We understand that mornings are busy and traffic can be bad but it is very important that children arrive at school on time. Please remember that you can use our Breakfast Club from 7.45am for only £3.50 per day, bookable via your Schoolmoney account.

Leave of Absence Forms

Children between the ages of 5 and 16 are not legally entitled to holidays in term time. We would ask that you consider the impact of your child missing time from school, even at a young age. It can prove difficult to settle a child after any absence, particularly a holiday. They will have missed valuable learning and may find difficulty making friends again after a long absence. Please remember to minimise taking

your child out of school in term time. Leave of absence in term time for holiday reasons will not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Any parent taking a child out of school without authorisation is liable to receive a Fixed Penalty Notice fine of £60 (per parent/carer) payable within 21 days. If unpaid, the fine increases to £120 with a further 7 days to pay and, if still unpaid, a summons is issued for the unpaid fine.

By taking family holidays during the designated holiday periods, you will be supporting your child's full school attendance, learning, development and progress.

Absence Notifications

When your child is absent from school, please remember to call the school office before 9.30am on each day of the absence. In order to comply with safeguarding procedures, we will contact you if we do not receive a message.
