Food in schools

We currently have some children in school with food allergies; some of which are triggered by the child eating certain foods and some triggered by the child touching the food. The most severe allergy can result in anaphylaxis, which can be fatal. We appreciate that some children bring a packed lunch to school and staff are aware of this. Should your child need to bring food to school for any other reason, e.g. because they go to an after school provision and need to take food / a snack with them, please let staff know so that we can store it safely until the end of the day. This will help us safeguard all our children.
