Parent Consultation Evenings

Parent consultations will take place during week commencing Monday 3rd February. Appointments sheets will be displayed next to the classrooms from Friday 24th January for parent/carer's to sign up to.

Detection, treatment and prevention of head lice

We have recently had a number of reported cases of Head Lice. Below is the advice we have received in relation to the treatment of it.

Head lice are a common problem in school-aged children and, whilst they can't be prevented, there are steps which can be taken to reduce the likelihood of them spreading.

We urge parents to undertake weekly checks of their children's hair and scalp using the 'wet combing' method. This method involves the following actions:

1. Washing the hair and applying conditioner
2. Combing hair through with a wide toothed comb to remove tangles
3. Taking a section at a time, pulling the detection comb through the hair, making sure the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots and draw down to the ends of the hair with every stroke
4. Checking the comb for lice after each section of hair is combed
5. Checking all family members at the same time
6. Treating all infected family members (those in whom live lice are found)
7. Repeating the process after completion of treatment to ensure that it has been effective

Where head lice are identified, it is vital that treatment is immediately sought from the GP or local pharmacist. It should be noted that, head lice treatment should not be used as a preventative measure and only where live head lice are present.

Pupils should **not** be absent from school due to head lice and are expected to attend school whilst undergoing treatment for such infestations.

Thank you to all Key Stage 1 parents/carers, who have expressed an interest in becoming a 'Reading Champion'. If you are interested in joining the team of Reading Champions, our rescheduled meeting will be in the school library at **2.30pm on Tuesday 21st January 2020**.

Reading Champions come into school regularly to read with children on a 1:1 basis with the aim to develop reading fluency and make reading an enjoyable experience. If you have a child in Foundation Stage and would like to listen to read with children on a 1:1 basis, please see your child's class teacher to arrange this.

Foundation 1 Homework

Foundation 2 Homework

Literacy

Read your book to an adult 5 times

Draw and label things that a pirate has. Listen to the sounds in the words and try to write them in the order you hear them. Please remember to form your letters correctly.

Numeracy

Can you find things at home that are different shapes? Try to find something that is a square, a circle, a triangle, and a rectangle. Draw these in your book and label them.
