FS 1 Happy Home Learning

This week we have been learning about Owls. Please make an owl at home. It could be a puppet, painting, drawing or a box model owl the choice is yours. Remember they will need wings, eyes and a beak.

FS2 Homework

Literacy

Maths

Get your favourite toy and use it to play a positional language game. See if you can follow what your grown up says and move your toy to match their instructions. You could use a table or a chair to help. They could say 'put your toy on top of the table' and see if you can do it. Try 'on top', 'below', 'next to', 'above', 'underneath', 'at the side of', 'in front' and 'behind'. You could draw your game or take photos of it if you like.
