Mathlete of the Week



On Friday 12th November we will be launching our **Mathlete of the Week** initiative to encourage children to develop essential fluency in number facts and other skills such as critical and strategic thinking skills by playing carefully selected games matched to their maths curriculum. Two children will be chosen from each class each Friday to take home a game that they have learned in maths to play at home with their family. The children will bring home a 'Kit bag' which contains the game, a playing card (instructions) and a diary. We would respectfully ask that you set up, play the game and pack it away with your child and then keep a tally of wins in the diary as we are going to have an Adults vs Children competition to see who are the best game players. We would also ask that you leave a top-tip about how your child engaged in the game or a game you like to play as a family which you would recommend to other families.

FS 1 Happy Home Learning

Personal, Social & Emotional Development: Draw a picture of you or make a paper plate face. Tell your grown up's why you are a good friend. Ask your grown up to write down why you feel you're a good friend and bring your work into school to share.

Physical Development: Using a long scarf or ribbon make firework movements in the air. You could make big explosions like a firework or hold it in front of you and make short movements like a sparkler.

Communication & Language Development: Watch fireworks together as a family, talk about the fireworks you looked at and saw. Describe what they sounded like and looked like.

FS2 Homework

Draw a picture of your experience of Bonfire night. Think about what you colours and shapes you could see. Try to think about the sounds the fireworks made and write the words on your paper – pop, bang, fizz...

Find and count objects in your home. Start with the number one and make a collection. It could be one toy car. Try two objects, then three objects. See if you can get all the way to 10.

Science (Y1 only)

In science we are learning how our bodies have changed over time and comparing what we can do to what we could do as a baby and a toddler.

Talk about what they looked like as a baby and how their appearance has changed and also about what they can do now that they couldn't do as a baby or toddler. Please send copies of the photos to school for our science session on Friday.

Maths

This week we have been playing board games that develop accurate counting and fluency in addition and subtraction facts. The children have enjoyed Frustration, Bust Stop Game and Cheeky Monkeys. Choose a board game with dice that you have at home and play as a family. Can your child identify the number of dots on the dice without counting? Can they add the amounts of both dice together by counting the dots and challenge themselves to calculate the total mentally? 
