Please refrain from taking any absence during MAY AND JUNE time



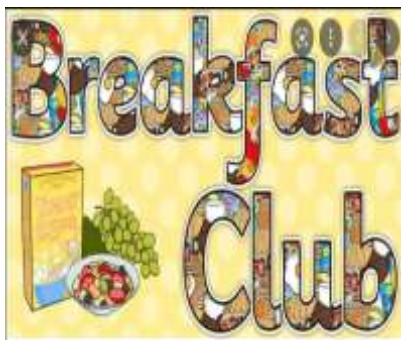
Reminder: Inset Day

FS1 Happy Home Learning

Physical Development: Please practice writing your name with the correct letter formation using your name cards which you received before Easter. Please use the handwrite rhymes in your diary to support your child.

Communication & Language: This week we have been learning and discussing what we are learning to persevere at, continue this by having a conversation about what you are good at.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development: This week we have been planting sunflowers. Go for a walk with your grown up's what flowers and plants can you see growing in your local park? Draw a picture of what you saw during your walk.

FS2 Homework

This week we have been researching and finding out information about the Queen. Do your own research on Google or in books and find out two more facts. Write them in your homework book and draw a picture of the queen. Eg. The Queen has got some Corgi dogs. The Queen lives in Buckingham Palace. (Remember to listen to the sounds you hear in words and write them down).

Number

This week we have been practising our counting patterns. Can you count to 20 or beyond to a member of your family. Then find different items to practise counting around the house e.g. The stairs, teddies, cars or dolls.

Class 6, 9 and 10 Homework

Y1 Spellings – no our out pull so some school goat coat boat road coach goal Can you think of any other words with 'goat in a boat' oa ?

Y2 Spellings- By the end of the year, your child must be able to read and spell all of the **Year 2 common exception words**. These can be found on page 30 of your home-school diary. Please practise reading and spelling any of the words your child is unsure of. We will be checking these over the next few weeks.

Reading

Your child will soon be receiving a copy of the Read, Write, Inc. QR codes for their target sounds. Over the next 2 weeks please could you access these short teaching videos to support your child to learn these sounds and words containing them in readiness for the phonics screening check which will take place the week commencing 6th June. If your child can accurately read words with their targeted sounds in challenge them to learn the next few sounds using the videos. Details of how to use the QR codes will be on the sheet provided.

Maths –

Y1-This week we have been learning to partition 2-digit numbers into tens and ones. Play this game using the following link to partition numbers up to 99. <https://ictgames.com/sharkNumbers/mobile/index.html>

Y2- Make two 2 digit numbers using the multiples of 10 and the ones. Use your knowledge of partitioning to add them. choose from this list 10 20 30 40 50 1 2 3 4 5

e.g. $23 + 44 =$ I know the answer is 67 because $40 + 20 = 60$ and $3 + 4 = 7$ so $60 + 7 = 67$

By the end of the year, your child must be able to read and spell all of the **Year 2 common exception words**. These can be found on page 30 of your home-school diary. Please practise reading and spelling any of the words your child is unsure of. We will be doing an extra long spell check next week!
