Maths

YR1 – Continue to practise counting backwards from 20.

Also this week we have been counting accurately to compare amounts and using the language 'more' 'fewer'. Get two different sets of objects. Count accurately and use the sentences 'There are more cars than bricks' 'There are fewer bricks than cars'

Y2- We have been making two digit numbers this week using equipment. Use straws or pencils to represent towers of ten and raisins to represent ones. Make these numbers 13 26 36 19 45 31 Explain what they are made up of and count accurately. E.g **32** '32 is made of 3 tens and 6 ones/units' Ten, twenty, thirty... thirty-one, thirty-two.

Class 5 and Class 8 Homework

Maths

Continue to practise counting orally forwards and backwards in ones, within 100. Take special care over those tens barriers. E.g. 28 **29 30 31 32**
