#### Maths

Y1-Use your knowledge of two digit numbers to work out the missing parts. Think about how many tens and ones are in the whole amount

$$\underline{\quad} + 3 = 23 \quad 20 + \underline{\quad} = 26 \quad 35 = \underline{\quad} + 5 \quad 42 = 40 + 2 \quad \underline{\quad} + \underline{\quad} = 56$$

$$\underline{\quad} = 40 + 9 \quad 13 = \underline{\quad} + \underline{\quad} \quad \underline{\quad} = 70 + 4 \quad \underline{\quad} + \underline{\quad} = \underline{\quad}$$

Now your adult could challenge you with some subtractions.

**Y2-** We have been investigating commutativity in multiplication. E.g Is  $2 \times 3$  the same as  $3 \times 2$  ? Use jottings or some practical equipment to show how the grouping is different e.g 2 groups with 3 in each and 3 groups with 2 in each? What can you notice about the answers?

**Spellings** – door floor poor even every everybody eye father

**Reading** - Keep reading your school texts little and often. Remember we aim for seven reads a week – even if it's just for five minutes!

**Maths** – Practise adding three one-digit numbers. Use your knowledge of bonds to help you recall them quickly in your head. E.g. look for number bonds within 10, number bonds to 10, doubles and near doubles.
