This week we have been learning all about crabs! See if your child can remember any of the facts we have learned at school. We would also love to see any pictures or paintings of crabs you create at home.

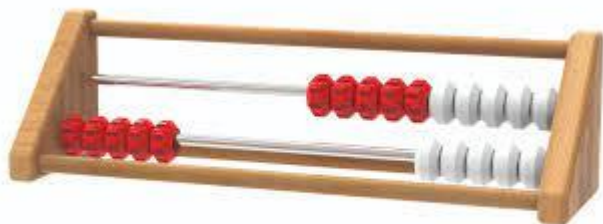
Song of the week:

Maths- This week we have been using a new resource called a rekenrek. The children have been subitising (recognising the amount without counting) the right number of beads. Encourage your child to practice subitising by drawing or arranging different objects for them to recognise the amount up to 5. Extra challenge up to 7.
