Road Safety

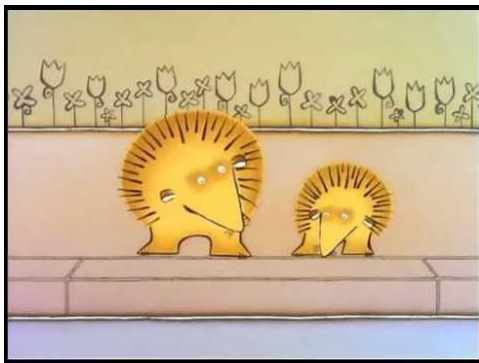

Class organisation for September 2023

As you are aware, classes are re-organised each year in readiness for the next academic year. This is a hugely complex process and staff have been working extremely hard over the last few months to organise classes for next academic year and put into place transition activities for the end of the summer term.

On Monday (3rd July), your child will bring home a letter which outlines the school class structure for September 2023 and informs you of their new class teacher. On Tuesday, they will meet their new teacher and classmates and have a story session with them. The following week, your child will start a series of transition visits / activities. Children will bring home a transition passport detailing these.

During the week commencing 17th July, all children will spend full days (Monday – Thursday) in their new September class. We would ask Parents and Carers to continue to bring them to this year's class for registration and collect them at the end of the day from this year's class.

They will then return to their current class and spend the last day of term (Friday 21st July) with their current class teacher.

All Parents and Carers are warmly welcome to come in to school to say a fond farewell to their child's current teacher and introduce themselves to their child's new teacher for September. Sports Day Reminders

FS1 Happy Home Learning

Song of the week: 3 blind jellyfish

This week has been all about jellyfish! See if your child can recall any of the facts we have been learning in class. Our number of the week has been number 3 – can you draw 3 jellyfish? You could even practise forming the number 3.

FS2 Homework

Literacy

In literacy this week we have been learning about whales. Please encourage your child to write a letter to The Deep to inform them about whales. Please scribe 'whale' for your child as we have not learnt these sounds yet.

E.g. The whale is big. A whale can sing. A whale is a mammal. A whale can swim slow and fast.

Spelling

Please encourage your child to practise their spelling in their spelling books. You could pretend you do not know how to spell the word, so your child needs to teach you.

Reading

Keep reading your school texts little and often. Remember we aim for seven reads a week – even if it's just for five minutes!

Challenge- Can you spell these words accurately in a sentence?

Y2 Class 6 – pretty, prove, should, steak, sugar, sure, told Can you spell each common exception word correctly in a sentence?

Y1 - As part of our maths work the children have been working on doubling. Please use the top marks hit the button game to support doubling and also number bonds

Can they see that 4 quarters is the same as 1 whole?
