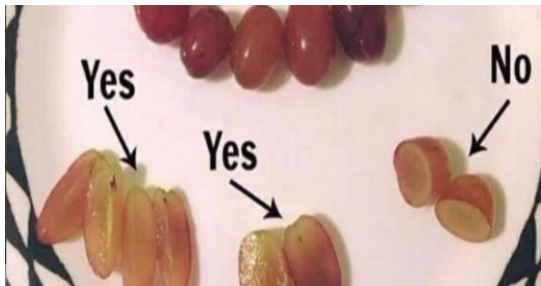

Grapes in Packed Lunches

We would like to remind parents that if your child has grapes in their lunchbox they **should always** be cut in half from top to bottom lengthways to prevent the possibility of choking. Grapes are a known severe choking hazard. The size and shape of grapes means they can totally obstruct young children's airways.



Grapes should always be cut lengthwise so they can pass more easily through smaller throats. Never slice width wise because they are still big enough to choke on. You should slice them downwards in half and cut them lengthwise again into quarters.

If possible please refrain from putting in lunch boxes.

Children ages 3+ welcome.

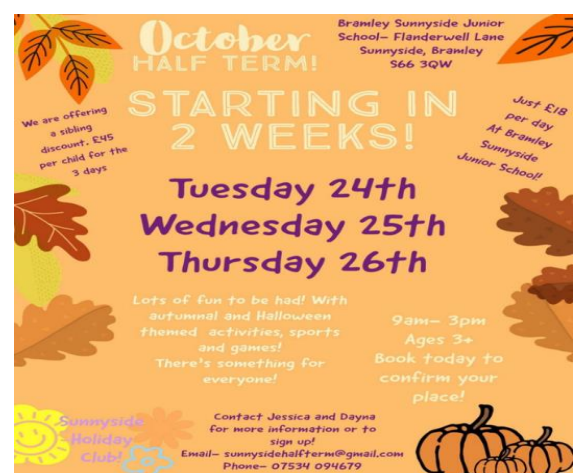

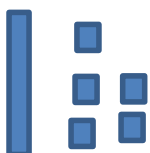

Maths

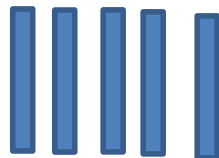
Y1-Oral counting backwards from 60. You can use the 100 square in your diary to help you. (There is no expectation to write the numbers)
