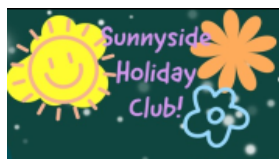

Safe Selfies

Taking selfies has become a popular form of entertainment for many children. Many like using filters to create funny pictures such as animal characters.

However, parents need to be aware of some of the risks relating to children taking selfies and sharing them online. These include:

- What Apps are they using? Photo sharing Apps such as Instagram and Snapchat are popular, but they have an age restriction of 13. You need to think whether your child should be using these types of Apps.
- If your child is using a smartphone, you should consider turning off the 'location services' which means that their whereabouts when uploading images is not included.
- Talk to your child about the fact that once an image is uploaded, it is very difficult to maintain ownership, as others can share, copy and re-send the image. It is really important to consider what is a suitable selfie.

Top Tips For Safe Selfies

1. **Limit who can see the types of selfies that your child takes.**
2. **Look at enabling settings on your child's device, so they are limited with who they can share selfies with.**
3. **Talk to your child about the importance of taking 'safe selfies'.**

FS2 Homework

This week we have introduced the key word 'I'. The children learn these decodable words as 'red words' and learn the phrase "you can't Fred a red". This is due to our phonics toy Fred helps us to read phonetically. Please encourage your child to write this letter in their homework books and then write the caption 'I am' and their name. They can then draw a picture of themselves. They could also practise reading this word by writing it on a piece of paper and using it as a secret password or code.

Please continue to play oral blending games with your child to support them with their early reading skills.

Y1- out shout round loud mouth What other words can you write that have this 'ou' sound?

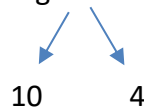
Y2- every everyone everybody My try dry cry fly

Maths

Y1- This week we have partitioned whole numbers 5 into parts. Can your child tell you parts that make 5 e.g 4 and 1 1 and 4 2 and 3 3 and 2 If your child can't recall the different ways then get them to use 5 objects that they can physically split.

Y2-This week we have partitioned teens numbers into parts (tens and ones) and extended this to partitioning other two digit numbers. Can your child fluently say what a number is made up of in terms of tens and ones/units? Can they write a number and show these parts e.g 14 is made of 10 and 4 10 and 4 makes 14
