Important Health Reminder - Measles

Following on from last week's newsletter please see the following information.

These are symptoms, we generally see before the rash.

- cold-like symptoms, such as a runny nose, sneezing, and a cough.
- sore, red eyes that may be sensitive to light.
- watery eyes.
- swollen eyes.
- a high temperature (fever), which may reach around 40°C (104°F)
- small greyish-white spots in the mouth.
- aches and pains.
- loss of appetite.



Sore eyes are a symptom you need to be particularly aware of.

Children who develop a rash suggestive of measles should stay away from school and get a swab done by GP. But it is important to note that children who develop measles can spread the infection a few days before the rash appears.

If there are **confirmed** cases in the community, it is advised that any child with a high fever (38 degrees C and above) and red eyes to stay away from school and get a swab done by the GP.

Should we receive any confirmed cases within school we will inform parents.

Y2 Class 6- We have been exploring lines of symmetry in 2D shapes. Can you make/cut out some 2D shapes and fold them to show the lines of symmetry.
