Peep is a 'Learning Together Through Play' programme, supporting families in amplifying their children's development within a home environment. By taking what they already do in an everyday routine, we aim to support development in children's communication & language, health & physical, personal, social and emotional, early maths and early literacy. Whilst doing this, we will show and suggest activities that are **low cost or no cost** and that can be done within their routine, all whilst contributing to their child's development. Food Tasting – Thursday 16th May 2024



Our school dinners are very popular and provide the children with a healthy and nutritional meal. A school meal is provided **free** of charge to all our FS2, YR1 and YR2 children. Parents only need to pay for school meals once the children start the Junior school.

On Thursday 16th May, children who normally bring a packed lunch will also have the opportunity to try a school dinner. You can still provide a packed lunch from home as well as you so wish. The dinner choice on this day will be:

Red choice – Our very popular Roast Chicken with Yorkshire Pudding with potatoes and vegetables.

Yellow choice – Quorn Burger

Both above options are followed by a Chocolate sponge & custard or Cheese or Summer fruit pancake

Green choice – a freshly prepared sandwich with Cheese or Tuna filling and fresh fruit or vegetable sticks

There is a varied menu operating on a 3 weekly cycle and are cooked freshly on the premises. All meals conform to strict food standards which ensure they are healthy and nutritious. Our past experience of these ‘taster days’ have shown that the children really do enjoy their school meal. In addition, many children went on to choose a school meal option every day, and parents were thrilled with the savings they made in terms of the time and money it took to provide a daily packed lunch.

- In recent times, several celebrities have been in trouble now for things they have posted on social media, even if it's a long time ago. More and more employers are also looking online to see what a potential employees digital footprint shows.
- It's important to remember when posting anything online, it has the potential to be seen by anyone, as clearly as a footprint in the snow.

A big thank you all the families and children that joined in with the Big Plastic Count Project. Our school collected a massive 7,547 pieces of plastic in a week, and this equates to using 392,444 pieces of plastic a year. Our results have been added to all the countries results and sent to the Government to persuade them to cut plastic production.

Thanks to supporters like you the Government has listened and has now started negotiations for a Global Plastics Treaty which will set a global target to reduce plastic. Also, The Global Oceans Treaty has now been agreed in 2024 and it is the biggest conservation win in history, which will now protect 30% of our oceans. Amazing news! Thank you for taking part.

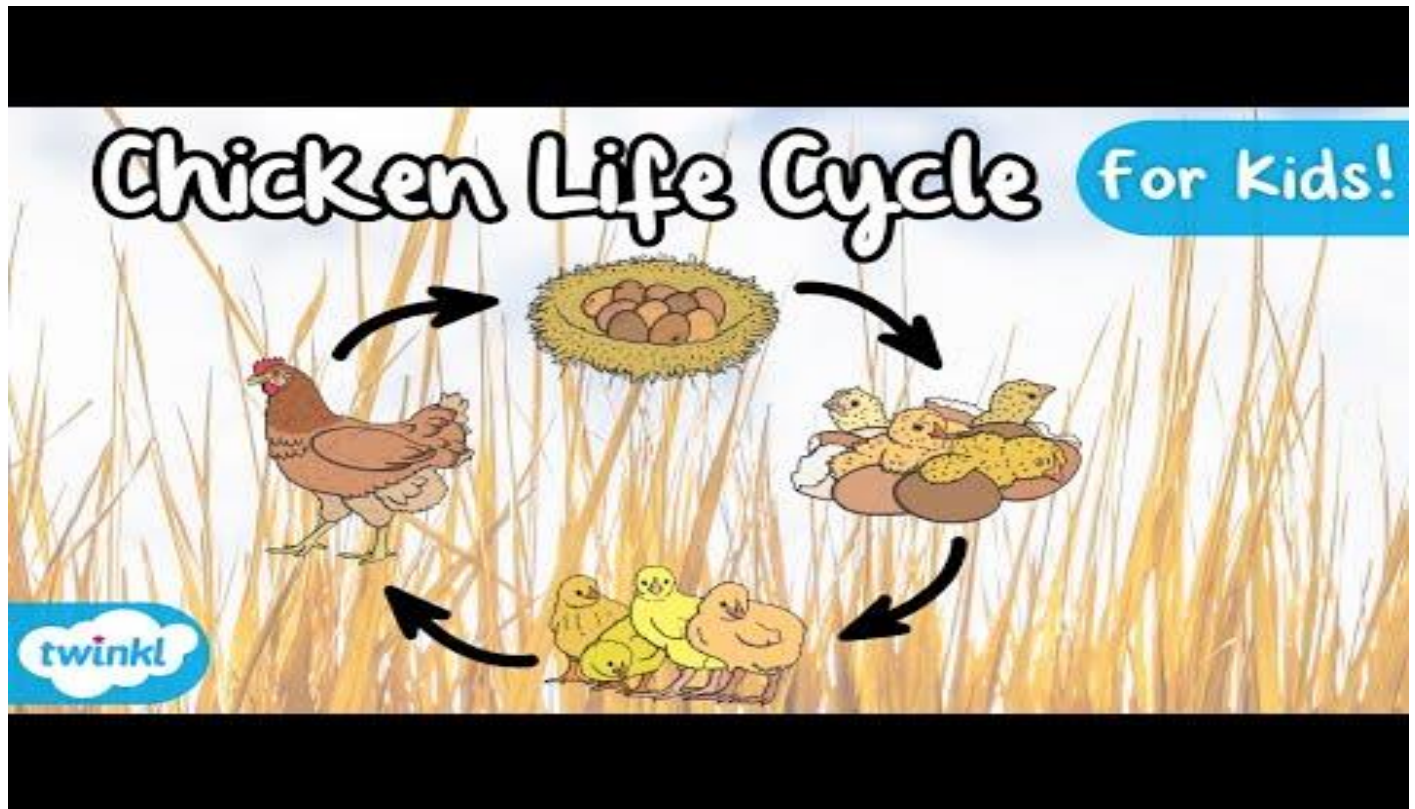
FS2 Homework

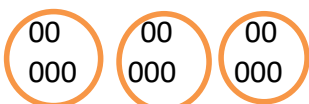
Y2 Class 6 – Please check your child can spell these words then try...**after past fast last class grass pass father**
