We want our children to learn to use drawing, painting and sculpture to develop and share their ideas, experiences and imagination. In order to appreciate the range of artists, craft makers and designers. We study local and national artists, investigating different techniques in using colour, pattern, texture, line, shape and space.



At Bramley Sunnyside Infant School we want our children to reflect their creative thinking and exploration of their ideas in each area studied.

Therefore, the use of sketchbooks shows how they have developed their skills. Children will observe and record from first hand experiences and as a school we exhibit our art showcasing our art at the Picture This exhibition each year.

Our young learners explore and play using a wide range of media and materials as well as providing opportunities and encouragement for sharing their thoughts, ideas and feelings through a variety of activities in art, music, movement, dance, role-play and design and technology. Children become accomplished users of sketching pencils, pastels, powder paint, clay and textiles. Through our creative and inclusive approach to the arts our children become confident, successful artists capable of producing sculptures, drawing, painting and textile skills.
